## CURRENT RESEARCH PROJECTS

My research centers on the broad theme of *risk and resilience*, with several studies specifically examining substance use in early, middle, or late adolescence as an outcome.

The **Adolescent Brain Cognitive Development (ABCD)** Study is the largest long-term study of brain development and child health in the United States. The ABCD study intends to elucidate the effects of substance abuse and other environmental influences on brain maturation and cognitive development, and will follow approximately 11,000 youth from age 9-10 until age 19-20, using bi-annual multimodal neuroimaging scans, neurocognitive batteries, and psychosocial assessments. VCU is one of the 21 sites involved. I am a co-investigator on the VCU Study Team, with the responsibility for overseeing recruitment of the non-twin sample at VCU for this multi-site, longitudinal investigation.

The **Culture, Race, and Health Transdisciplinary Core**. This project, conducted with funding from the Office of the Provost ([www.iCubed.vcu.edu](http://www.iCubed.vcu.edu)) and support from the College of Humanities and Sciences at VCU, addresses how culture and race/ethnicity impact health and overall well-being, in particular among individuals served by the Crater Health District, who experience high levels of health disparities. Environmental and social factors along with cultural beliefs and experiences influence how health and illness are faced and how health services are accessed and received. This core is engaging in transdisciplinary team science to understand the mechanisms underlying health disparities and to develop culturally informed interventions that are acceptable to community members are likely to reduce disparities. The team is co-led by Drs. Faye Belgrave, Wendy Kliewer, and Maghboeba Mosavel.

**Project HEART: Health and Resilience in Teens** was a pilot study based in Richmond, VA, co-led by Drs. Wendy Kliewer (VCU Psychology) and Jo Robins (VCU Nursing). Project HEART examined associations between cumulative risk (CR) and physiological markers of cardiometabolic risk factors (e.g., blood pressure, body mass index, waist circumference, blood glucose, lipids, C-reactive protein) in 108 African American teens and their biological mothers. Factors that may moderate these associations also were assessed. Home interviews with mothers and teens and overnight fasting blood work were collected from both members of the dyad. Project Heart<sup>2</sup>: Health, Epigenetics, and Resilience in Teens and Moms, collected information on adolescent and maternal telomere length and genome-wide DNA methylation status. We are in the analysis and writing phase of the project and are developing a pilot intervention based on our findings.

**Project CARE: Community Assessment of Risk and Resilience**, was based in and around Durban, South Africa and focused on the concept of cumulative risk (CR) – the piling up of sociodemographic, psychosocial, and environmental stressors – and adjustment across a broad array of domains including academic, cognitive, emotional, behavioral, and physiological functioning. Home-base interviews with 324 caregiver and youth dyads, neurocognitive assessments with 182 youth, and school records provided data to address (1) relations between CR and functioning and (2) to identify youth who demonstrated resilience despite risk. We are in the analysis and writing phase of the project. This project is co-led by Drs. Wendy Kliewer (VCU) and Basil Pillay (University of KwaZulu-Natal).

The **Myanmar Youth Health Study**, co-led by Drs. Nanda Wan and Wendy Kliewer, is a study of risk and protective factors for high school students' substance use in Myitkyina, Kachin State, Myanmar. The *Communities That Care* survey was adapted for use in this study and was administered to 1,900 students in 10 high schools in Myitkyina. Dr. Wan oversaw the survey administration; Dr. Kliewer's lab downloaded, collated, scanned, and analyzed the data. We are in the analysis and writing phase of the project.

**Project COPE**, led by Dr. Kliewer, was a 4-year longitudinal study funded by the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA/NIH). The goals of Project COPE were to understand how exposure to community and peer violence, poverty, and similar stressors are associated with physiological responses to stress and to adjustment (drug use, aggression, academic performance, anxiety, and depression), and to glean why some youth fared better in the face of exposure to violence than others. Families (a maternal caregiver and one adolescent), beginning when the adolescent was either in the 5<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> grade, were recruited from moderate to high violent neighborhoods in the greater Richmond area and interviewed annually. In year 3 we interviewed a subset of biological and social fathers. Data collection ended in 2009. We are continuing to analyze and write up quantitative and qualitative findings from this project.
